Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ November 19, 2023

"Immediately the one who received the five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole and buried his master's money. Now then! Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given... but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away."

God has endowed us with a variety of gifts or as the word of the gospel state, talents. Some have more, others less, but in the eyes of God He wants us to acknowledge them and use them well.

Two words which come to mind, both for the church, its leaders and politicians as well are transparency and accountability. But these are words which apply to our own Christian lives. ### **U.S. Religious Orders Could Face \$10 Billion Deficit for Care**

A November 6<sup>th</sup> announcement from the U.S. Bishops' conference about next month's national religious retirement collection came with a chilling warning that a very small percentage of religious communities actually have enough money to care properly for their elderly members. The National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO), which runs the collection, reported that only 6 percent of the religious communities that shared data with the office last year have sufficient retirement funding, and the financial strain they experience becomes more significant as average ages go up and healthcare costs increase. The annual collection will take place nationwide the weekend of Dec. 9-10. (Crux)


