Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe ~ November 26, 2023

"I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord God. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.... 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

We bring the church year to a close with the appropriate gospel judgement scene. We will all, each and everyone, meet our just judge, where our every deed will be exposed and evaluated. A recently published book told the story of a priest who met a person, who said that he felt quite comfortable, as he kept the ten commandments. The priest then asked about his concern for Matthew 25, the judgement statement 'I was hungry, thirsty, naked, an immigrant or foreigner, sick...' the corporal works of mercy. As we live them we are going to be judged, not just the ten commandments or the great commandment of Jesus to love God and neighbor. The man replied that he hadn't thought about that. Do I?


Second Collection

LIVING NATIVITY - We are in need of many children to be part of an outdoor Living Nativity, complete with live animals for both locations:


New Philadelphia Tree Lighting on Sunday, November 26th at 5:00 PM

Vatican Doctrine Office Reaffirms Catholics cannot be Freemasons

The Vatican Dicaster for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF) released a document on Wednesday reaffirming that Catholics are forbidden from becoming Freemasons. The new document signed by Pope Francis and DDF Prefect Cardinal Victor Fernandez was written in respose to a bishop from the Phillipines who had expressed concern at the groowig number of Catholics in his diocese who are taking part in Freemasonry and asked for suggestions for how to respond pastorally. IS RELIGION GOOD FOR YOU?

IT'S COMPLICATED, NEW GLOBAL REPORT FINDS

A new report from Gallup finds that religious people around the world report being more positive, have more social support and are more involved in their communities than those who are not religious. The study, based on 10 years of data, also finds the well-being of religious people varies from country to country and is often hard to measure. Even if researchers find that religion is good for you, people who are not religious may not care about its benefits or want anything to do with it. (RNS)
